## Environmental impact statement

An environmental impact statement (EIS) is required as part of the approval process for a state significant development in NSW.

It is a report that assesses the potential environmental, social and economic impacts of a proposed development.

It aims to help the community and other stakeholders make informed submissions or decisions about the project.

An EIS will include specialist studies, investigations and other assessments, depending on the type of project, and its location and context within the environment and community.

An EIS must be prepared by appropriately qualified impact assessment practitioners and reviewed by a Registered Environmental Assessment Practitioner or REAP.

Once complete, an EIS is made a public document.
